Request for Proposals for Horseback Spraying Teton County Weed & Pest District

PURPOSE & REQUIREMENTS

Teton County Weed and Pest (“the District”) is soliciting proposals for invasive plant treatments utilizing horseback sprayer systems. Detailed projects to be determined by members of the Jackson Hole Weed Management Association (JHWMA) on an annual basis. Average contract award has been \$35,000-50,000 annually. Contract amounts are subject to change based upon priorities and available funding.

The herbicide treatments shall be completed by October 30th of each year. Treatment schedule to be coordinated with the JHWMA.

The following should be included/considered in the proposal:

- Labor costs
- Transportation costs
- Spray Equipment and maintenance
- Stock use
- Any other costs necessary to perform the job
- Application records shall be provided to the District according to WY Department of Agriculture requirements
- GIS equipment provided by the District for tracking of location and treatment activities
- Herbicide provided by the District
- Locations may include any area within Teton County, Wyoming including but not limited to the Bridger-Teton National Forest (including wilderness areas), Grand Teton National Park, National Elk Refuge, State of Wyoming lands. Precise locations will be determined annually
- Bids may provide a daily or hourly rate as determined by the contractor

Successful contractor shall provide proof of liability insurance per the contract in addition to a WY Commercial Pesticide Applicators License. (Draft contract attached)
